1. New SCN Congregation



BMC welcomes Living Stream Church of the Brethren as the newest member of the Supportive Communities Network (SCN). CHURCH OF THE BRETHREN Living Stream is the first online congregation in the Church of the Brethren and streamed its first worship service earlier this month. Audrey deCoursey, founding pastor of the congregation, sees this experience as "a kind of laboratory for exploring worship with new media, where we learn together what draws us to each other,

what soothes our spirits, what uplifts us from our alienation, and what challenges us to grow." The congregation begins as a welcoming congregation, affirming "the image of God in all persons – of every age, gender identity and expression, race, ability, ethnicity, nationality, class and sexual orientation – and celebrates each person's call to serve the world and the church." 2. A Tipping Point: Some Reflections on the Recent US Elections

In social change movements there is often a moment known as the tipping point. This is the stage where enough momentum or critical mass has been generated that change becomes nearly inevitable. Many see the recent US elections as a tipping point for lgbt equality in the US as voters approved marriage equality in three states (Washington, Maryland and Maine) and defeated a hostile constitutional amendment barring same sex marriage in Minnesota... How these changes will impact the Church of the Brethren and the Mennonite Church remains to be seen. Leadership that is attentive to social shifts must be increasingly aware that our denominations cannot continue along the same paths upon which we have been merrily traveling...

5. Booth Updates

BMC has received notice that its application for an exhibit booth at the next Church of the Brethren Annual Conference has been approved. This marks the second year for a booth.

In October, BMC applied for booth space for this summer's Mennonite Church USA Assembly. To date, we have not yet heard whether our request has been granted.

6. Brethren Volunteer Service (BVS) Update

Faced with intense pressure, on June 1, 2012, the General Secretary of the Church of the Brethren withdrew the invitation for BMC to be a BVS placement site, reneging upon a signed covenant. We are pleased to report that, after a long delay, representatives from the BMC board and the Mission and Ministry Board of the Church of the Brethren, will be meeting in February for face to face conversation. Please keep us all in your thoughts and prayers.

7. Germantown Mennonite Follow-up

We reported last month that in a surprise move, the Eastern District Conference in Pennsylvania voted to end the liaison relationship that it had maintained for ten years with Germantown Mennonite Church following the congregation's expulsion as full members from EDC because of their welcome of lgbt people. In response, the Mennonite SCN pastors have met via a conference call and made several decisions, including the drafting of a letter encouraging denominational leadership to take action. In addition, Carol Wise will travel to Germantown in April to preach and share with the congregation. We will provide updates as they become available.



8. Lutheran Volunteer Corps December Workshop

Reuben and Brit Barkholtz, a Lutheran Volunteer working for Reconciling Works, led a half-day workshop in Minneapolis for Lutheran Volunteer Corps volunteers of the Twin Cities. The workshop focused on addressing heterosexual and cisgender privilege and how to be an ally. Reuben was impressed by the active participation and sensitivity of the attendees.
